TROY FIESINGER, M.D., SWORN IN AS TAFP VICE PRESIDENT

ARLINGTON, TEXAS — Troy Fiesinger, M.D., of Sugar Land, Texas was sworn in as vice president of the Texas Academy of Family Physicians during the 60th Annual Session and Scientific Assembly in Arlington. Dr. Fiesinger assumed his duties on July 25 at the annual Installation of Officers and Awards Lunch.

Dr. Fiesinger currently serves on the faculty of the Memorial Family Medicine Residency Program where he practices full-spectrum family medicine including obstetrics and office procedures. He earned his medical degree at Baylor College of Medicine in 1996 and completed his family medicine residency at the East Carolina University School of Medicine/Pitt County Memorial Hospital in 1999. Before joining the residency program, Dr. Fiesinger practiced family medicine at the Scott and White Clinic in Waco and served as the regional clinic director for quality and safety at the Scott and White Memorial Hospital and Clinic in Temple. From 2006 to 2009, he served as the clinic medical director of the Lone Star Family Health Center in Conroe, a federally qualified health center.

Dr. Fiesinger is involved in many aspects of TAFP and AAFP. Over the years he has served as a member of the Commission on Core Delegation to the American Academy of Family Physicians; chair of TAFP's Commission on Public Health, Clinical Affairs and Research; a member of the TAFP Liaison Committee with Managed Care Companies; and a member of the TAFP Executive Committee.

During his year as TAFP Vice President, Dr. Fiesinger will work with other officers in leading the Academy: President Kaparaboyana Ashok Kumar, M.D., F.R.C.S., of San Antonio; President-elect Melissa Gerdes, M.D., of Whitehouse; Treasurer I. L. Balkcom, IV, M.D., of Sulphur Springs; and Parliamentarian Clare Hawkins, M.D., of Baytown.
